Sub: Application for letter of permission for functioning of Dhanvantari Homoeopathic Medical College & Research Centre Dhanvantari Campus, Kamatwade Cidco, Nashik, Maharashtra- 422008 for continuing BHMS course with intake capacity of 50 seats for the academic year 2025-26-regd.

Sir,

Dhanvantari Homoeopathic Medical College & Research Centre has applied for permission for sanction of BHMS course with 50 seats for the academic year 2025-26. The College has submitted the Part I information in which the entire functional profile has been narrated. MARBH conducted Inspection on 27.02.2025 & 28.02.2025, followed by hearing on 19.05.2025. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board has examined the College as to whether the college fulfills the Minimum Essential Standards to be fulfilled as per the prevailing regulations under clauses 26 and 28 of the NCH Act 2020. On careful examination of the report, the Medical Assessment and Rating Board observed the following shortfalls: -

1. Teaching faculty.

- a) 01 Professor in the department of anatomy.
- b) 01 professor in the department of physiology.
- c) 01 professor in the department of materia medica.
- d) 01 professor in the department of pathology.
- e) 01 professor in the department of practice of medicine.
- f) 01 professor in the department of surgery.
- g) 01 professor in the department of gynecology and obstetrics.
- h) 01 professor in the department of community medicine.

As evident from the above statement, a total number of eight teachers are deficient against the requirement of 40+1 for 50 seats UG college (As specified in MES,2024). Pursuant to F.No.:3-2/MARBH/NCH/2025-26/162-169 dated 16/04/2025 issued by MARBH, a college can avail 10% relaxation against the required number of teachers for Academic Year 2025-26 only. After allowing relaxation of 10%, college still has a deficiency of four teachers. However, such a relaxed number of teachers may be appointed at the earliest for smooth conduct of course.

2. Hospital functioning

- a) Male yoga instructor not appointed.
- b) General physician post vacant.

3. Miscellaneous

- a) Not registered in AEBAS portal.
- b) NABL accreditation for clinical laboratory not done.
- c) The salary of teaching staff and non-teaching staff is not as per MES 2024.

4. Considering the above observations during inspection and hearing, MARBH has decided to issue **Permission to Dhanvantari Homoeopathic Medical College & Research Centre Dhanvantari Campus, Kamatwade Cidco, Nashik, Maharashtra- 422008 for continuing BHMS course with intake capacity of 40 seats reduced from 50 seats for the academic year 2025-26.**


5. All admissions shall be made from NEET qualified candidates only. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 40 UG seats shall be treated as All India Quota. Counseling for seats under all India quotas shall be conducted by respective Counseling Authority of State/UT govt as designated by Central Government and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or, shall be conducted by the concerned counseling authority of the state/UT.

6. The Category wise list of the selected candidates may be informed to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Homoeopathy after the process of admission is completed. Any admissions carried out other than NEET qualified students will not be approved by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board.

7. If the College is aggrieved by any decision of the Autonomous Board, college may prefer an appeal to the Commission against such decision within 30 days of the communication of such decision as per National Commission for Homoeopathy (Assessment and Rating of Medical Institutions) Regulations 2024, section 14 subsection (1) and NCH General Regulation 2023 'section 22. The Manner of instructions for appeal are attached.
