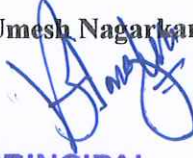

Objectives	To provide practical exposure to the functioning of the judicial system; understand courtroom proceedings and medico-legal practices; familiarize students with the role of medical professionals in legal cases; correlate theoretical concepts with practical judicial proceedings.
Activity Details	The Department organized an educational visit to the District Court, Nashik on 17th July 2026. Students accompanied by Dr. Sanhita Sharma and Dr. Yogini Mahajan reached between 11:00 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. Attendance was recorded and a geotagged group photograph was taken at the court entrance. Students were welcomed by



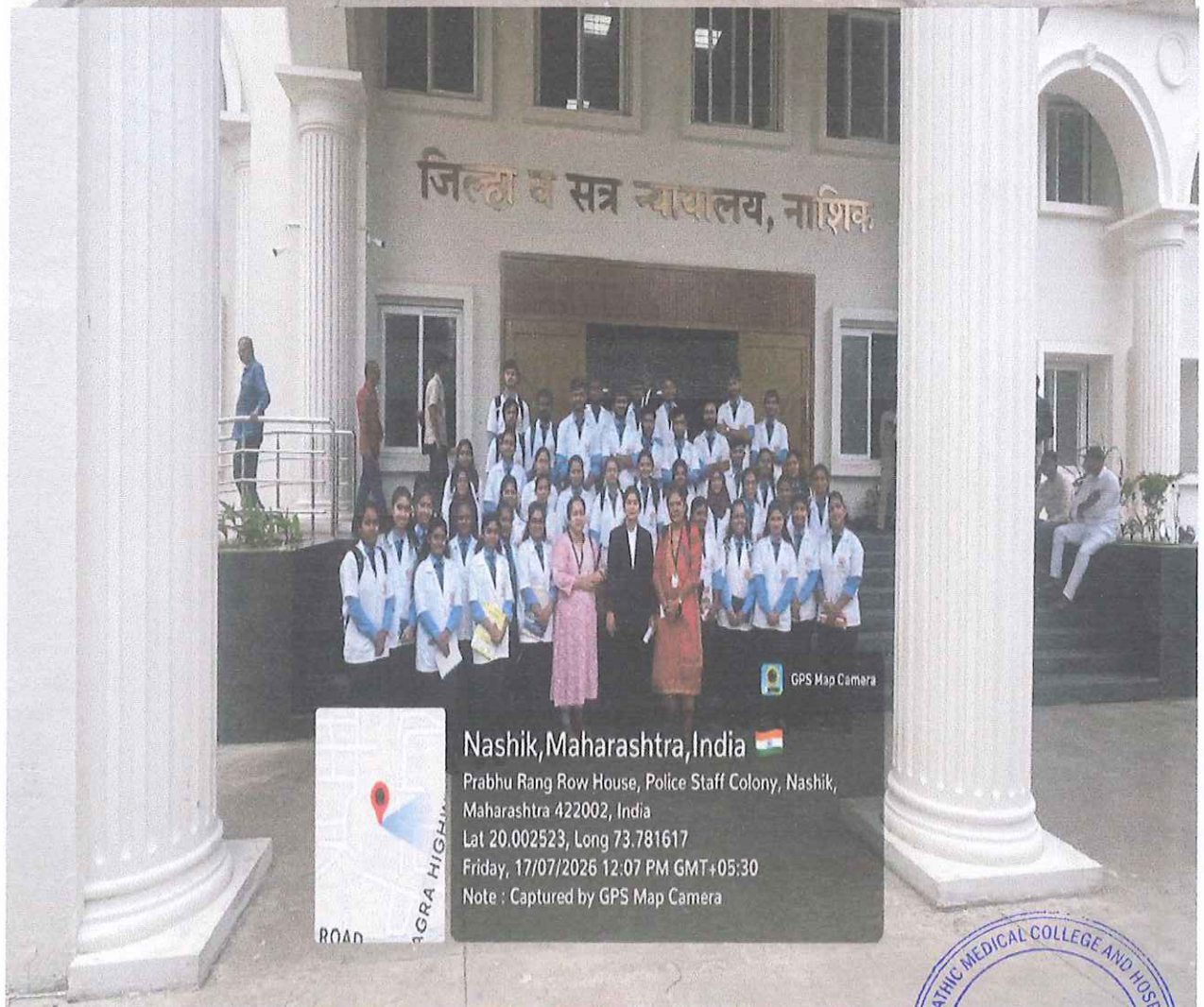
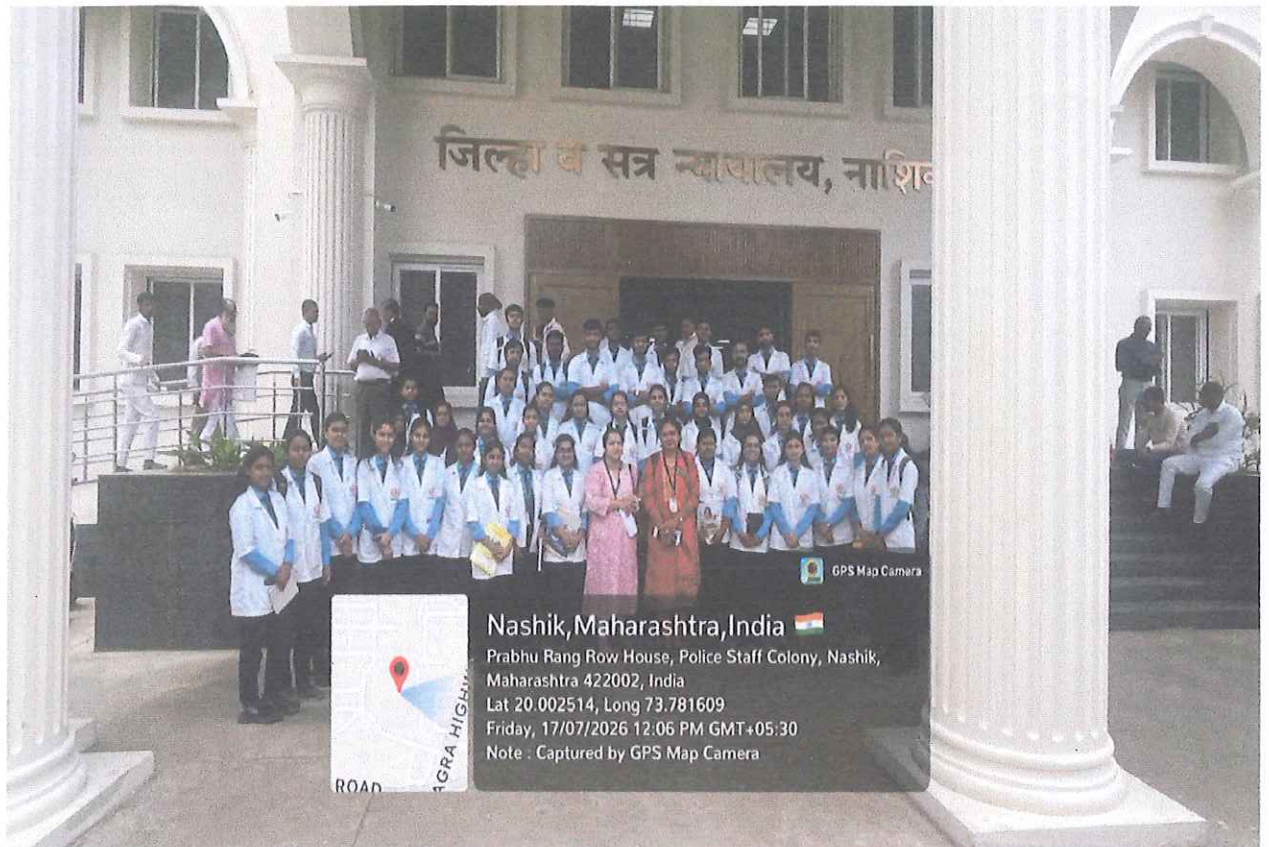
	Advocate Amruta and Advocate Aparna and divided into three groups for guided observation of different sections of the court. They observed courtroom proceedings, learned the roles of judges, advocates, prosecutors, court staff, courtroom etiquette, legal documentation, filing procedures, medico-legal evidence, witness examination and the role of doctors as expert witnesses.
Learning Outcomes	Students understood the structure and functioning of the District Court, courtroom procedures, judicial protocols, medico-legal documentation, and the role of doctors in judicial proceedings.
Student Feedback	Feedback forms were collected. Students reported that the visit was highly informative, improved their understanding of courtroom proceedings and medico-legal practice, appreciated the guidance by Advocate Amruta and Advocate Aparna, and recommended similar visits in future.
